Purpose:

- Once a term each member should provide a brief summary of the term's work.

- If you submit a paper you should give a brief presentation on that work, such as an overview of the methodology accompanied by relevant figures/charts.
- Please use the lab meetings as an opportunity to practice a talk and receive feedback prior to presenting it at a conference.
- Please feel free to organize a "brainstorming" session to discuss a topic of interest.
- Please feel free to suggest inviting non-lab members to participate. This could be via telephone/video-conference, or by inviting someone to travel to SFU for a visit. If the latter, please obtain permission from Charmaine regarding funding travel arrangements.

These are informal meetings. Each week the coordinator assigns a member to take responsibility for bring snacks to the meeting for the full research team.
